- CSES does not guarantee the transferability of its credits to any other institution unless there is a written agreement with another institution.

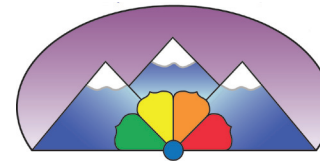
### Facilities, Equipment, Personnel

This pamphlet provides basic information and disclosure of key aspects of Colorado School of Energy Studies' educational programs, in accordance with requirements of the State of Colorado.

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### Educational Services

- Overall Objectives: CSES programs are adult education courses in Craniosacral Therapy and Polarity Therapy. The objectives of CSES programs are occupational development for health-care professionals and personal growth.
- Programs are generally 7 hours/day beginning at 9 a.m., with a 90-minute lunch period and a 15-minute break per 75 minutes of class.

### Type of Instruction

- CSES programs are conducted in-class with at least one CSES instructor present. CSES programs are not correspondence, telecommuting or residential.

## PROGRAM LENGTH & TUITION, WITH EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Craniosacral Therapy Intro      5 days (31 hours)      \$650**  
*Objective: To gain an overview of Biodynamic Craniosacral Therapy (BCST), and become proficient in providing safe, effective beginner-level BCST care with clients. This class is half lecture, half hands-on practice, with 10 ethics hours.*
- Craniosacral Therapy              50 days (342 hours)      \$7,500**  
*Objective: To become proficient in BCST based on the standards set by BCTA, IABT and Karuna Institute. This is the foundation training for professional BCST practice. This class is half lecture, half hands-on practice, with 100 ethics hours.*
- Polarity Therapy Level 1          16 days (100 hours)      \$1,980**  
*Objective: To gain an overview of Polarity Therapy, and become proficient in providing safe effective beginner level Polarity care with clients, including using Polarity with other therapeutic modalities. This class is half lecture, half hands-on practice, with 32 ethics hours.*
- Polarity Therapy Level 2          52 days (352 hours)      \$5,850**  
*Objective: To become proficient in the full content of Polarity Therapy. This program qualifies the graduate to take the APTA BCPP test. This class is half lecture, half hands-on practice, with 104 ethics hours.*
- Verbal Coaching                  20 days (135 hours)      \$2,475**  
*Objective: To become proficient in providing verbal support for clients, particularly within a touch therapy context. Taught in a lecture format, it includes 40 ethics hours.*
- Polarity Therapy Coaching        16 days (100 hours)      \$1,980**  
*Objective: To become proficient in providing coaching support for clients using Polarity Therapy principles and methods, based on the book “Dancing with Yin and Yang” by John Chitty. Taught in a lecture format, it includes 32 ethics hours.*
- Polarity Two-Chair Method        4 days (25 hours)        \$495**  
*Objective: To become proficient in using the Polarity Two-Chair method with coaching clients, based on the book “Dancing with Yin and Yang” by John Chitty. Taught in a lecture format, it includes 4 ethics hours.*
- Working with Babies              4 days (25 hours)        \$495**  
*Objective: To learn the theory and method for a five-step session for very young children, using Polarity Therapy, BCST and related methods. Taught in lecture format, it includes 4 ethics hours.*
- Understanding Embryology        4 days (25 hours)        \$495**  
*Objective: To gain knowledge of the earliest developmental phases of human life, and to appreciate the implications for life coaching and therapies of all kinds. This course is taught in a lecture format.*

b. A deadline for the new start date, beyond which the start date will not be postponed.

If the course is not commenced, or the student fails to attend by the new start date set forth in the agreement, the student will be entitled to an appropriate refund of prepaid tuition and fees within 30 days of the deadline of the new start date set forth in the agreement, determined in accordance with the school’s refund policy and all applicable laws and rules concerning the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981.

After 10% but within first 25% of program charge	75% less cancellation

Upon withdrawal/termination, students receive all of their unused prepaid tuition, rounded off to the nearest 10% amount. For example, a student who prepays for a program and terminates after one half of the modules will receive 50% of the prepaid tuition.

1. The student may cancel this contract at any time prior to midnight of the third business day after signing this contract.
2. All refunds will be made within 30 days from the date of termination. The official date of termination or withdrawal of a student shall be determined in the following manner:
  - a. The date when CSES receives notice of the student’s intention to discontinue the training program; or
  - b. The date on which the student violates published school policy, which provides for termination.
  - c. Should a student fail to return from an excused leave of absence, the effective date of termination for a student on an extended leave of absence or a leave of absence is the earlier of the date the school determines the student is not returning or the day following the expected return date.

Students may not begin a new CSES program while still owing for a prior CSES program.

- Fees: In addition to tuition, students may incur costs including:
- Books (2015 cover price of new books is shown):
  - Craniosacral: \$238
  - Polarity 1: \$83
  - Polarity 2: \$110
  - Lab fee (optional) Craniosacral: \$50
  - Other programs have no required reading or fees
- Sessions Received requirement for Certification: The national associations in each modality require the applicant to receive sessions, and these may have costs that vary with different providers. In addition, certification may require association membership fees and other expenses.
- Practitioner certifications come from national associations, not CSES. These membership and application fees are separate from costs of the CSES program. CSES maintains “approved school” status with these associations so that CSES graduates are assured of qualifying.

## Refund Policy

Students not accepted to the school are entitled to a full refund of any money paid. Students who cancel this contract by notifying the school within three (3) business days are entitled to a full refund of all tuition and fees paid. Students who withdraw after three (3) business days, but before commencement of classes, are entitled to a full refund of all tuition and fees paid except the maximum cancellation charge of \$150.00 or 25% of the contract price, whichever is less.

In the case of students withdrawing after commencement of classes, the school will retain the cancellation charge plus a percentage of tuition and fees, which is based on the percentage of contact hours attended in the program, as described in the table below. The refund is based on the official date of termination or withdrawal.

Postponement of a starting date, whether at the request of the school or the student, requires a written agreement signed by the student and the school. The agreement must set forth:

- a. Whether the postponement is for the convenience of the school or the student, and;

## Entrance Requirements

- Minimum age for admission to a CSES training is 18. A high school diploma or equivalent is required. Advanced trainings may require satisfactory completion of entry-level programs, including payment of prior tuition.
- CSES does not discriminate based on age, gender, sexual orientation, race, religion, lifestyle, disability or ethnic origin.
- An application is required for enrollment.

## Attendance Policy

- Absence at more than 5% of the regularly scheduled events of a program may cause withholding of Certificate of Completion, until the material missed has been satisfactorily completed. CSES will help students accommodate schedule problems, including providing makeup options.
- Students are not charged for make-up events for which payment has already been made as part of the overall tuition.
- Leave of Absence: CSES attempts to accommodate students’ needs for a leave of absence in the event of illness or major life changes.

## Progress Policy

- Evaluation activities are part of each program schedule. In evaluations, instructors use a variety of methods, including interview and demonstration, to determine student progress. Progress status is communicated orally. CSES programs use a pass/fail grading system. Students making unsatisfactory progress are given options to improve skills. These options include attendance at additional events, tutorials, and practice supervision.
- Each full program has a written examination conducted in the last module. Introductory classes do not have an examination.
- Formal transcripts are available after completion.

## Conduct Policy

- CSES reserves the right to dismiss a student for disruptive behavior or lack of satisfactory progress. CSES can make this dismissal based on subjective criteria, with power of final decision vested in the program

manager. In the event of dismissal, a pro-rated refund is given. A dismissed student may re-apply for any program, but CSES is under no obligation to re-accept the student, or to provide support for gaining status with APTA or BCTA.

## Placement Assistance

- Colorado School of Energy Studies provides no job placement assistance. Current law prohibits any school from guaranteeing job placement as an inducement to enroll students.

- CSES supports application to APTA and/or BCTA for certification, at the time of program completion.

## Grievance Policies

- CSES attempts to resolve grievances quickly and to the full satisfaction of the student. Students should contact the instructor or administrator immediately.

If the complaint is unable to be resolved, CSES is also subject to state laws protecting consumers.

Students may file a written complaint online with the Colorado Division of Private Occupational Schools at [higher.ed.colorado.gov/dpos](http://higher.ed.colorado.gov/dpos) or by requesting a complaint form at (303) 862-3001. All student complaints submitted to the Division must be in writing and shall be filed within two years after the student discontinues training at the school.

CSES does not require exhaustion of its internal grievance/appeal process before filing a complaint of any nature including, but not limited to, a claim of a deceptive sales or trade practice, with the State of Colorado and through the Division of Private Occupational Schools.

## Two-Year Limit on Complaints

- The Division of Private Occupational Schools has a two-year limit for acting on student complaints.

## Financial Policies

- Tuition: Average cost is based on \$140 per day of training. CSES program payment is due at the beginning of the event. Payments are normally made at the beginning of each module.
- Prepayment: A 5% discount is given for entire-program pre-payment of trainings of over 20 days.
- Tuition is for an entire program, not a segment of a program. Days absent must still be paid as if attended.
- Payment plans may be available on a limited basis. Payment plans require no interest. These may be arranged through an interview. Financial aid is not available for applicants paying for other professional training running concurrently with the CSES event.
